

Rotary Club of Solon Leads the Way in 2006

After just successfully raising \$1,100 as the team “Lead the Way”, in the recent Solon Relay for Life, the Rotary Club of Solon began its second year with the induction of new officers Thursday June 15, 2006 and the 2006 Annual Rotary Club of Solon Golf Outing to be held Monday August 14, 2006.



Incoming President, Stacie Beck, has designated the Club motto for 2006 to be Lead the Way. Other incoming officers are David Schmader, President Elect; Martin Baris, Treasurer; Mark Mizenko, Secretary and John Groth, Sergeant at Arms. The induction ceremony was held at Max and Erma’s in Solon which is the new meeting place for the Club. In addition to the change of meeting place, the meeting time is changing to 11:30 AM beginning July 6, 2006.

This year’s Solon Rotary Golf Outing will be held August 15, 2006 at the Aurora Golf & Country Club, one of North East Ohio’s most scenic and challenging golf courses. Proceeds from the event will benefit the United Mitochondrial Disease Foundation. The cost of the event is \$140 per golfer or \$500 per foursome. This price includes entry into all the events, 18 holes of golf, riding cart, breakfast, lunch and various awards. Registration and breakfast begin at 7:30 AM. Last year’s golf outing, was also, held at Aurora, and raised \$6,000 for the victims of Hurricane Katrina.

Formally called The Centennial Rotary Club of Solon, it was chartered on February 23, 2005, the 100th Anniversary of the founding of Rotary International. The Club was the 57th to join Rotary District 6630.
